

Notice of Settlement, Judgment, Award, or Other Payment

- Once case has settled, appropriate documentation must be furnished to the MSPRC.
- Required information includes:
 - Date of Settlement, Judgment, Award, or Other Payment
 - Amount
 - Attorney's Fees (borne by the beneficiary)
 - Other procurement costs borne by the beneficiary (itemized)
 - In some instances a copy of the settlement/judgment/award will be requested as well as a copy of the release signed in connection with the settlement, judgment, award or other payment.
- MSPRC takes attorney fees and other procurement costs borne by the beneficiary into account when computing a final demand amount (see 42 CFR 411.37). Note: If the beneficiary's representative hires another individual or entity to resolve any Medicare recovery claim, this fee may not be included in the procurement cost. This is not a cost incurred to obtain the settlement, judgment, award or other payment.
- The "Final Settlement Detail" document can be found at MSPRC.info website. This is a form one can use to fill in the above required information.



Final Demand Letter

- Once appropriate documentation concerning a settlement, judgment, award, or other payment is received by MSPRC, a final demand letter is generated.
- Payment is due within 60 days of the date of the demand letter.



Final Demand Letter Interest

- Interest accrues from the date of the demand letter and will be assessed on the outstanding balance on day 61 if no payment is received within 60 days of the date of the demand.
- Payment is applied to interest first, principal second. Requests for appeal or waiver of recovery do not stop the accrual of interest.
